RECYCLING - Composting

Making Your Own Composting Pile

Starting a compost pile is as simple as following a recipe and the kitchen is from where most of the compost ingredients will come from. Below are a few composting basics, including what to use and what to avoid.

How to Get Started and What is Needed

- 1. Compost Bin Make a container or buy a container to use for compost materials. The container or bin will 'store' your food scraps or smaller compostable items.
- 2. Pitch Fork The best hand tool for turning your large, outside compost pile.
- 3. Location Create your compost site at a level area, well drained and close enough to access.

Compost Recipe Ingredients

Composting components equal greens, browns, water, air and time. Organic materials are suitable and the pile should be made up of the proper ratio of carbon-rich materials (browns) such as dry leaves, straw, wood chips and paper sacks, nitrogen rich materials (greens) such as grass clippings, kitchen scraps; egg shells, orange rinds, vegetable parings, fruit parings and coffee grounds. The ideal ratio is 25 parts browns to 1 part greens.

Things to Avoid

Do not use any meat, fat, grease, oils, dairy, bones, animal droppings, lime or ashes. Do not use any part of a black Walnut tree as it contains a plant poison that survives composting. Eucalyptus leaves may also be toxic.

Other Composting Tips

- Keep the pile moist but not soggy. If it is too wet, it will smell. If it is too dry, decomposition will be very slow.
- An ammonia odor may indicate an imbalance mix of ingredients. Add sawdust to control odors.
- Grass clipping break down quickly and contain as much nitrogen as manure.
- Avoid meat and fish scraps, these may attract rodents and cause problems.
- When the pile is smaller and the color is dark brown, your compost is ready to use.

HIDhio Updates

Defiance SWCD has been working on wrapping up the H2Ohio 2022 crop year. We are hoping to be sending out payments in April for the 2022 crop year practices which include small grains, manure incorporation, overwintering cover crops, and forages. If you are a producer in H2Ohio that planted wheat but decide to destroy the crop, after March 15th, be sure to contact our office. We should be able to change the small grains payment for 2023 into an overwintering cover crop payment instead for crop year 2022.

As the H2Ohio producers get ready for the 2023 planting season, be sure to have any updated crop rotations and modifications to your voluntary nutrient manage plan into our office. This includes any new soil tests that were sampled in 2022 or the spring of 2023. After planting, turn in any VRT or placement fertilizer invoices for the 2023 crop. Our office will make 2023 implementation, VRT, and subsurface placement practice payments in the summer. Please try to be timely after planting on getting records turned in so that we can move forward with program payments. This three-year program ends after March 15th 2024, but be looking for new H2Ohio program practice information coming out for crop year 2024 and following years in the late summer or fall of 2023. Thank-you for participating in the H2Ohio program and we wish you all a safe and successful planting season.

DITCH MAINTENANCE REPORT

Administered by Defiance Soil & Water Conservation District in cooperation with the Defiance County

Commissioners & Defiance County Engineer

Kevin Hancock, Ditch Maintenance Administrator

The Defiance County Ditch Maintenance Department treats drainage improvements as vital infrastructure to Northwest Ohio. Currently the Maintenance Department is responsible for maintaining 375 miles of drainage improvements. As new conservation of improvement projects are completed they are placed on the schedule, adding miles of maintenance each year. Agricultural producers and rural landowners in Northwest Ohio have been concerned with the need to dispose of excess water.

For agricultural producers, excess water means delays in plantings, replanting, soil compaction, reduced yields and delay in harvesting. For homeowners, excess water can mean damage due to flooding of dwellings and property.

The cost of new construction or the reconstruction of drainage improvements greatly exceeds the cost of maintaining the improvement once construction is completed. That is why, once a project is constructed, the County Commissioners are required by law to place the improvement under the Defiance County Ditch Maintenance program.


